CareLines: Volume 3, Love (8:7)

OCTOBER 11

Many waters cannot quench love.

Song of {s 22221}Solomon 8:7

The cold waters of death didn't even slow the Lord's love, let alone quench it. His love was (and still is) so immense that nothing could stop the greatest act of love that man has ever shown. He died at Calvary voluntarily, so that we wouldn't have to spend eternity in the lake of fire. That is love.

SEPTEMBER 23

I am my beloved's, and his desire is toward me.

Song of {s 22221}Solomon 7:10

Stop and think about that for a minute. It is indeed wonderful that we belong to Christ. But think what we mean to Him. His desire is toward us. He thinks about us ALL THE TIME. He cares for us all day long. He pours out unnumbered blessings on us. He has a home waiting for us in heaven. Hallelujah, what a Saviour!

The bride in Solomon's Song was totally occupied with her beloved. And there was no one else who could come close to him in the bride's eyes. "He is altogether lovely," she says. This is just a picture of what the Lord Jesus should mean to each of us. He is our beloved. We are His bride. When we consider Him, we too can say, "He is altogether lovely. This is my Beloved, and this is my Friend."

NOVEMBER 17

Thou art all fair, my love; there is no spot in thee.

This is how the groom views his bride and this is how the Lord views His bride, the Church. No spot? Right! Because every evidence of sin was removed by the Lord Himself through His blood shed on the cross of Calvary. Now all those who believe in Him are perfect in His sight. We are all fair; there is no spot in us. This is most wonderful and is true of every child of God.

S. of Sol. 2:4

We sometimes make banners that announce "Happy Birthday" or "Welcome Home", or other joyous sentiments. Our verse today spreads a banner over a special guest of honor at a banquet. It reads simply "LOVE". That's what each of us experience as Jesus brings us into THE BANQUETING HOUSE. There is only one place where there is true love. That's the Lord's banqueting house.
